Ecolabels for paper based products in Europe – Overview





EU Ecolabel for:

- Printed Products
- Newsprint Paper
- Tissue
- Copy and Graphic Paper



- RAL-UZ 14 Recycled Paper
- RAL-UZ 56 Recycled board
- RAL-UZ 72 Printing and Press Paper
- Tissue, wallpaper, filter paper



- UZ 24 Printed Products
- UZ 02 Graphic Paper
- UZ 18 Products made from recycled paper (stationery)



Nordic Ecolabelling of printing companies, printed matter, envelopes and other converted paper products

These four schemes are "Type I" criteria according to ISO 14024







Ecolabels for paper based products in Europe – Characteristics of "Type I"



- Issued by independent bodies and involvement of interested parties
- Intended for both private and commercial end users
- Draw attention to one or more critical environmental aspects
- Are relevant to public purchasing
- Have a high level of credibility

Ecolabels for paper based products in Europe – Contents



Each ecolabel is awarded to a defined product range/types.

All ecolabels give criteria or at least statements about:

- Emissions
- Energy consumptions and efficiency
- Product additives, chemicals (paper / printing)
- Waste of the manufacturing process (paper / printing)
- Substrate (ratio of secondary and primary fibres)
- Recyclability















EU Ecolabel for Printed Products (1)



- Is awarded to a specific printed paper product
- Applicants are publisher, editor, book seller, printers, advertisers/public relation agencies, private companies and public institutions



Documentation should be provided by the printing house

Criterion 1: Substrate

Printing on paper certified with the EU Ecolabel as established in Commission Decision 2011/333/EU→ no preference for recycled fibres except for newsprint (at least 70% recycled fibres)

Criterion 2: Excluded or limited substances and mixtures Covers printing inks, biocides, washing agents, solvents







EU Ecolabel for Printed Products (2)



Criterion 3: Recyclability

- → Deinkability: ERPC Deinkability Score (based on INGEDE Method 11)
- → Non-soluble adhesive removability: INGEDE Method 12
- → Wet strength agents:

PTS Method PTS-RH 021/97

"Testing must be performed on a final product representative of the worst case reference."

Criterion 4: Emissions

Covers printing process emissions to water and air









EU Ecolabel for Printed Products (3)



Criterion 5: Waste

Waste management for all residual products derived from the production of printed paper



Criterion 6: Energy use

Covers all energy consuming devices and a programme for measures for improvement energy efficiency

Criterion 7: Training

All members of staff shall be given appropriate training and knowledge







EU Ecolabel for Printed Products (4)



Criterion 8: Fitness for use

The product shall be suitable for its purpose



Criterion 9: Information on the product

"Please collect used paper for recycling" shall appear on the product

Criterion 10: Information appearing on the EU Ecolabel Guideline for the use of the logo

- The oldest ecolabel worldwide (established 1978)
- 13 000 products and services
- Substrate: Strongest criteria for paper products (recycled fibres or 100 % sustainable forest management)
- Revision of awarding criteria for recycled paper, printing and press paper, recycled board, tissue, filter paper and wallpaper is in progress:

Important modifications	Awarding procedure no.
No mineral oil in printing ink and chemical additives	RAL-UZ 14 Recycling Paper RAL-UZ 56 Recycling board
Deinkability and removability of adhesive applications according to ERPC Scorecards	RAL-UZ 72 Printing and Press Paper







- Products from recycled paper UZ 18 (for files & folders, exercise books, stationery...)
- Graphic paper UZ 02 (for writing paper, print and copy paper)



- Printed products UZ 24: What is specific?
 - There are no general deinkability criteria for all printed products
 - But: Criteria of the ERPC Scorecard apply to toner and (ink jet-) inks, UV-printing inks
 - Adhesives: For hot melts the recyclability criteria according to ERPC Scorecard must be met
 - Better description of the awarding options (Testing of defined title or testing of paper-ink/-adhesives combinations)







Nordic Ecolabel – "Nordic Swan"



What is specific?

 A system of mandatory and optional scoring points for the applying printing company



Recyclability:

 Adhesive applications must pass the ERPC Removability Scorecard with at least 51 points www.nordic-ecolabel.org

 Deinkability must be proven with at least 51 points of the ERPC Deinking Scorecard

Comparing the ecolabels

 Blue Angel has the highest substrate criteria → in combination with revised printed products criteria it will give the strongest ecolabel standard

What is in progress

- EU Ecolabel for converted products (folder, filing, envelopes, paper bags – draft stage)
- Blue Angel for printed products (no draft yet)

What is still missing

Ecolabel for packaging products
